Minutes – September 8, 2019

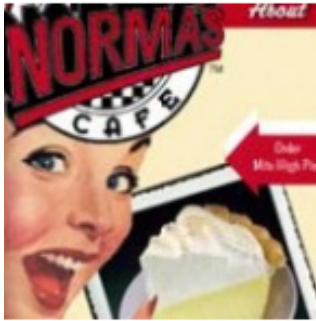
American Pride Air Show in Addison
